

# Humberside Police Divisional Headquarters and Custody Suite, Clough Road, Hull

Humberside Police is committed to improving frontline services. To help us achieve this, the new facilities based at Clough Road, will bring together the range of police functions which allow us to improve our response to the people and businesses of Hull. The new buildings will be designed to the latest requirements for delivering operational policing, whilst reducing our impact on the environment using sustainable technology.

## Questions you may have

**What are the benefits of a new police station?**

A - The new Police Station is more centrally placed to serve the needs of the City and is closer to the main residential areas. This will reduce the travelling involved for officers responding to incidents in Hull. Bringing together the wide range of policing services to the one site will also improve our ability to respond to incidents and fight crime. The buildings are designed to reduce running and maintenance costs, saving money.

**How will this affect access to the police?**

A - The new Divisional Headquarters will have public access to the police service and is located to improve incident response to the whole City. A police base, housing our Neighbourhood Policing Team will also remain in the central commercial area of Hull. In addition, we are working to improve access via phone, email and through our network of public access points across the local area.

**Can I still report a crime in the city centre?**

A - A police base will remain in the City Centre. Most people like to report crime by phone and this service will not be affected.

**Will the development create local jobs?**

A - The Police will be working with contractors to ensure that many of the construction jobs will be available to local people. We will also be looking to source as many of the materials as possible for this project from local suppliers.

**What are the sustainable technologies?**

A - The new building will aim to generate 30% of the energy it uses on site using renewable technology including solar panels, small wind turbines and a biomass boiler. This exceeds the requirements placed on us by local planning and the Home Office. This will reduce energy costs and carbon dioxide emissions. The amount of energy produced on site and the money that has been saved will be displayed in the facility when it is operational.

**How will the development affect the residents and businesses in the area?**

A - The development includes a custody suite and we understand that this may cause local residents and businesses concern. We are sensitive to communities local needs. Our Neighbourhood Officers will continually work alongside the community to address any local concerns.
