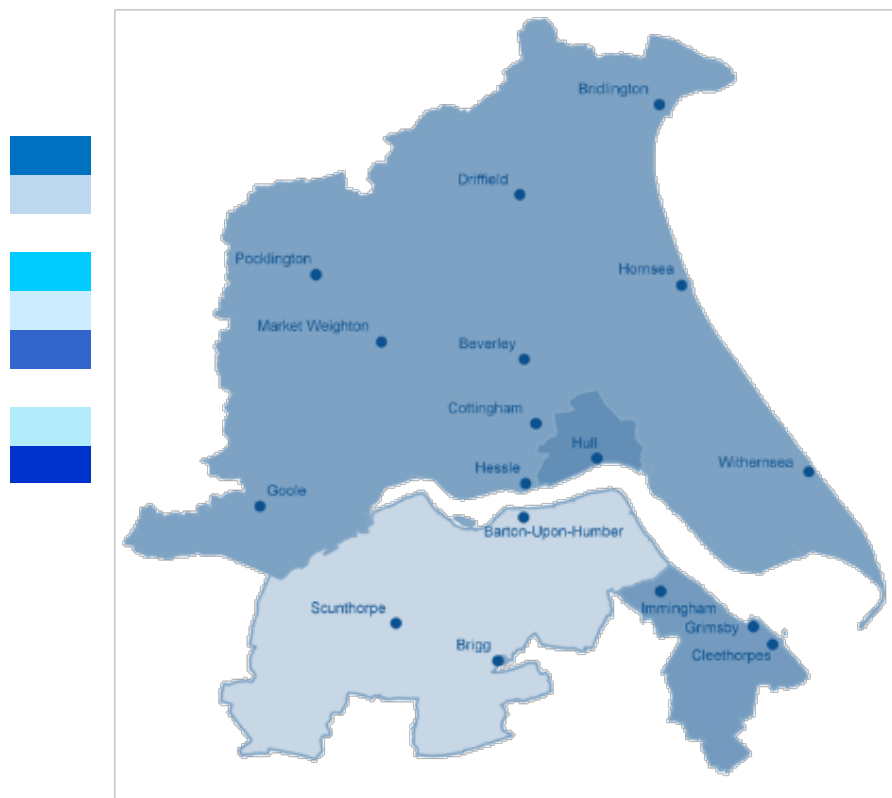

## Humberside



- A combined population of just under 1m people
- Annual budget of £174m
- Mixture of policing requirements – urban to rural
- Provide specialist & some enabling services in collaboration with South Yorkshire Police
- All undertaken under the backdrop of prolonged financial pressure to reduce budgets and provide value for money services



# The Police & Crime Commissioner for Humberside (PCC)

- PCC role replaced the Police Authority in 2012
- Keith Hunter – 2<sup>nd</sup> PCC
- Elected in 2016 for 4 years
- Oversees the work of Humberside Police, ensuring the effectiveness and efficiency of policing services across the four areas.
- Holds the Chief Constable to account on behalf of local people.
- His role also includes...



## The Commissioner's role

- Represent and engage with those who live and work in the force area, including the vulnerable and victims, to identify their policing needs
- Setting priorities and publishing a Police and Crime Plan to deliver them
- Setting the police precept and budget
- Holding community safety budgets and commissioning services
- Enable communities to be more resilient
- Ensuring that community needs are met as effectively as possible
- Improving local relationships, building confidence and restoring trust
- Working with agencies and partnerships at local and national level to make sure there is a unified approach to preventing and reducing crime.
- Publishing an Annual Report



# PCC's National Role



Member of Association of Police & Crime Commissioners (APCC)

- National lead for Local Policing and Partnerships.
- Deputy National lead for Police Performance.



## Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Humberside

- OPCC Engagement Officers (EO)....he can't do it all

- One Officer in each Local Authority Area
- To represent the PCC acting as his eyes and ears in communities
- To work with the Public, Agencies and the Police to resolve issues and reduce crime
- To keep the PCC informed about how the public feel about the policing and victim services they receive
- To help the public and partners understand where to direct requests for service

And lots more...



# What we don't do.....

- We are not part of the Police Service – we are separate
- We do not police the police
- We cannot get involved in operational policing matters eg investigation of a particular incident
- We do not investigate complaints about how the police do their job or police officers. (Unless it's the Chief Constable)
- We DO ....
  - monitor the service delivered to the public
  - Sign post people to the right person or organisation



# The East Riding

- Just under 1000 Square miles
- 350,000 Population
- 1 district council
- 13 Town Councils
- 155 Parish Councils





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# Crime Reduction Funding

- The PCC provides funding to the East Riding Community Safety Partnership for grants to Voluntary organisations and community groups (with a bank account) for community safety projects.
- Up to £10k for one year
