# Some facts you may or may not know about speed and the consequences.

- Around two-thirds of crashes in which people are killed or injured occur on roads with a speed limit of 30 mph or less.
- At 30mph, vehicles are travelling at 44 feet (about 3 car lengths) each second.
- Even in good conditions, the difference in stopping distance between 30 mph and 35 mph is an extra 21 feet or 6.4 metres, more than 2 car lengths.



# What is Community Speed Watch?

- CSW is the scheme title for officially trained volunteers who monitor the speeds of vehicles passing through their communities.
- The teams are made up of a minimum of 6 volunteers with 1 person assuming the role of team coordinator.
- Roadside monitoring sessions require 3 fully trained, able bodied volunteers who carryout the roles between them.
- The CSW teams are monitored and randomly checked for accuracy.



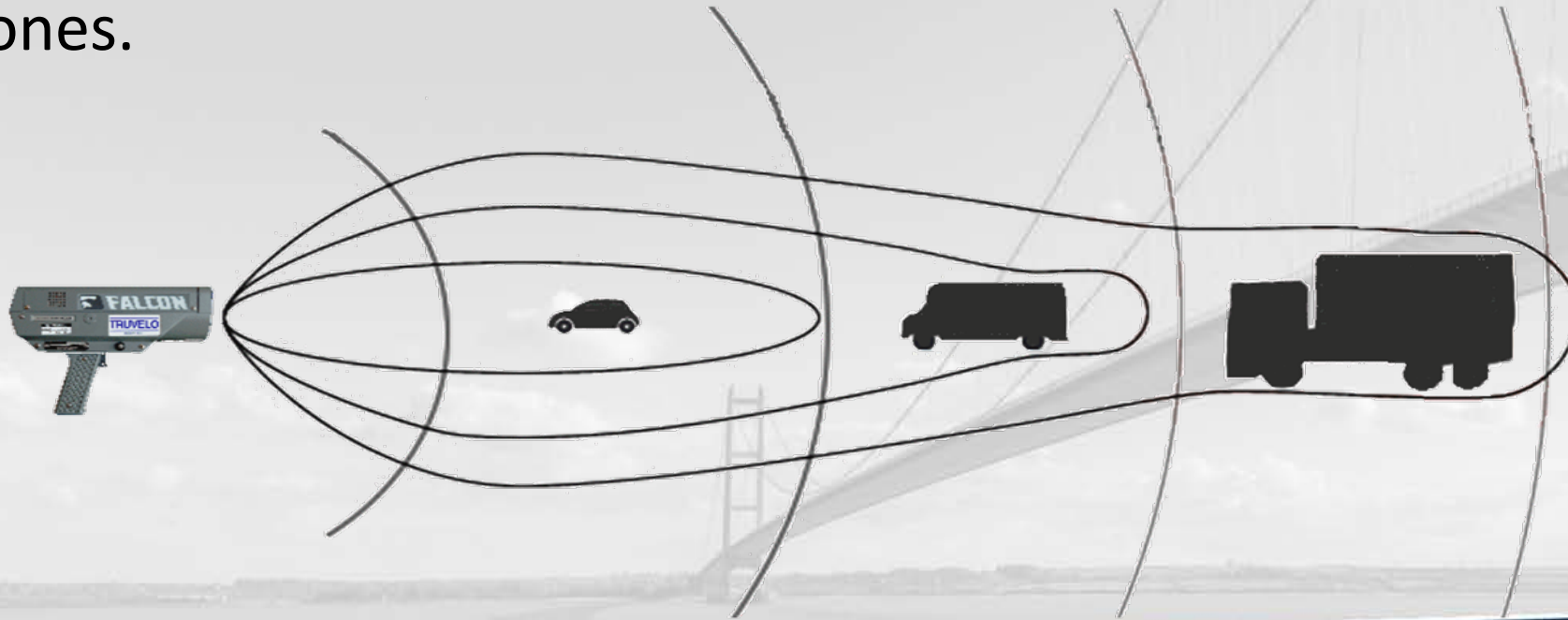
# The Equipment and Consequences

- The equipment used for CSW monitoring isn't HOTA certified, meaning it is used for education not enforcement.

# Where and When can we operate?

- Each CSW scheme can have 6 locations, each one needs to meet the minimum criteria for safety not only for you but also for the motorist who come across the teams who are monitoring.
- For safety reasons the monitoring is only conducted in daylight hours.
- Currently, we only monitor 30mph and 40mph zones.
- Remember; this is voluntary, you can do as much or as little as you feel you want too.



# What do you need to record for a session?

- The NPCC guidance states; Speeding is only recordable at 10% + 2mph above the limit for CSW purposes.
- For speeding vehicles only, we need the speed, vehicle registration number, base colour, make if known, model if known and the time of speeding in 24 hour clock format.
- The total number of vehicles driving through the session is also required.
