SPECIFIC DETAILS

Population data

Data for each quarter is examined, and compared to the 2001 population census data. Communities within Humberside have changed dramatically since 2001, however Police Criminal Evidence Act Codes of Practice direct that census data be used for comparison. Population figures are believed to be up to between double and three times the 2001 census figures. ***This should be borne in mind during the scrutiny process***
Up to date census figures are due to be published in 2011.

Stop Search data

Highlight this Quarter

The total number of stop and searches force wide has increased this quarter. The total number of BME stop and searches has increased in all Divisions except for A Division.

Stop & search leading to arrest

Highlight this Quarter

With the exception of D Division the percentage for BME arrests is 0%.

DCC's Scrutiny Panel

Mr Griffin noted that in relation to the 0% arrest rates the numbers involved are small and that there are no concerns.

Disposal methods for detainees

Highlight this Quarter

There has been a slight decrease in the number of prisoners dealt with this quarter. For white prisoners all disposal methods have increased except for NFAs. All BME disposals have decreased except for to court(not on remand) and to court on remand, however the numbers are small. The number of prisoners dealt with by way of NFA has decreased.

DCC's Scrutiny Panel

Mr Griffin noted in relation to NFA, the numbers involved this quarter cause no concern.

Force tickets issued

Highlight this Quarter

This quarter with the exception of the number on courses, all tickets issued to the BME community are the same or less than the previous quarter. There has been a small rise in the number of unknown ethnicities for Endorsable Notices and VDRs, all other unknown ethnicities have decreased.
In relation to Year to Date data the number of Non Endorsable Notices issued has decreased by nearly 2000. There are fluctuations in the number of tickets issued to the BME community but the numbers involved are small. The number of unknown ethnicities are similar to previous data except for VDRs which has increased by over 40.

DCC's Scrutiny Panel

In relation to the quarter data Mr Griffin noted no concerns.

In relation to the Year to Date data Mr Griffin question whether there was a particular reason for the increase in the number of unknown ethnicities for VDRs. No explanation could be given.

Racially & Religiously aggravated crime

Highlight this Quarter

Force wide with the exception of C Division the number of Racially and Religiously Aggravated crimes recorded and detected has decreased, however with the exception of B Division all detections rates have decreased.

DCC's Scrutiny Panel

Mr Griffin noted that although there has been some slippage with the rates the numbers involved are small.
