SPECIFIC DETAILS

Population data

DIVERSITY SCORECARD 2011/12 QUARTER 3

Data for each quarter is examined, and compared to the 2001 population census data. Communities within Humberside have changed dramatically since 2001, however Police Criminal Evidence Act Codes of Practice direct that census data be used for comparison. Population figures are believed to be up to between double and three times the 2001 census figures. ***This should be borne in mind during the scrutiny process***
Up to date census figures are due to be published in 2011.

Stop Search data

Highlight this Quarter

It was noted that force wide there has been a marked increase in the number of stop searches recorded. The percentage of white stops has increased, whilst the percentage of BME stops has decreased.

DCC's Scrutiny Panel

It was suggested that this could be due to the cessation of stop talk and late submission of forms. Mr Griffin confirmed that he is content with the trends which are comparable to previous quarters.

Stop & search leading to arrest

Highlight this Quarter

Generally the percentage of both white and BME arrests has fallen this quarter.

Disposal methods for detainees

Highlight this Quarter

Generally this quarter there has been a decrease in the number of prisoners dealt with. There has been a decrease in the number of white prisoners dealt with by all disposal methods with the exception of 'On bail to Police Station' which has increased. There are fluctuations in the number of BME prisoners dealt with, however the numbers are largely similar to those of the last quarter. NFA figures and percentages are down on the last quarter.

DCC's Scrutiny Panel

Mr Griffin stated that the figures presented are proportionate and was reassured that there is parity in the figures for white and BME disposals.

Force tickets issued

Highlight this Quarter

It was noted that there has been a marked increase in the number of VDRs issued throughout the force. It was also noted that there has been an increase in the number of tickets submitted with undefined ethnicity.

DCC's Scrutiny Panel

It was confirmed that the issue with undefined ethnicity will be continually monitored.

DCC's Scrutiny Panel Action

Investigations to be made with the Roads Policing Section to ascertain whether there is an explanation for the increase in VDRs issued over the last quarter.

Action Update -It has been confirmed that during this period a Winter Driving Campaign was conducted, various vehicles were stopped and checked to ensure that they were adequately maintained, the aim of this campaign being casualty reduction, thus explaining the increased in VDRs issued.

Racially & Religiously aggravated crime

Highlight this Quarter

Force wide and across all Divisions there has been an increase in detection rates and Police Authority targets have been far exceeded. It was noted that in this area the force is in the top four nationally.

DCC's Scrutiny Panel

Mr Griffin expressed thanks to colleagues in all divisions for these exceptional results.
